Complete the following timetable to help you map out your path to the M.A. Though students will complete their M.A. at different paces (as some students will have transfer credit, some will take summer courses, and so on), this timetable can serve as a guide and as a useful way for you to remain in sync with your graduate adviser.

This is a timeline for those intending to write a thesis. Unsure about whether you'd like to write a thesis or take the oral exams? That's okay! To complete this timetable, begin at the very end by filling out when you intend to graduate and then work your way back up to the top. Specific university-wide deadlines will change every year, so make sure to cross-check this timetable against the UNC-Charlotte's updated schedule. Coursework: You'll need a minimum of 30 hours of coursework (the equivalent of 10 courses). That works out to about 3 courses per semester during a two-year program. It's suggested that your first semester and your last semester (when you're writing) have a lighter workload.
